



Since January 1, 2005, Pro Arbeit - Kreis Offenbach - (AöR) has been responsible as a municipal job centre for the basic security for job seekers in the area of the Social Security Code II (SGB II) for the district of Offenbach. As a municipal job centre, it is our legal mandate to support people in social emergencies. The European Project Management (EPM) is a young innovative team of Pro Arbeit, created for the implementation of transnational projects, which enables our organization to participate on a European level. We are not only a part of the consortium in various projects, but we also bring our experience and expertise to the European committees working for a social and engaged Europe.



Since 1997, KIZ provides support and advice to people from various backgrounds to integrate into the labour market or to set up their own business. It is currently active in over 20 cities and districts and has served over 30.000 customers and supported the start of over 6.000 businesses across Germany. The trainings address underserved, disadvantaged target groups but also graduates of universities and vocational academies. KIZ has a very strong entrepreneurship related network in the Rhein-Main Area. In cooperation with the City of Offenbach, KIZ is driving the local network »City of Entrepreneurs«. It is the German partner of the world-wide organization "Youth Business International", and is since 2017 an intermediary organisation in Germany for the Erasmus for Young Entrepreneurs programme.



Aliseicoop is a social cooperative born in 2001 which operate in Umbria and Campania. Over the years, the cooperative has built wide-range strategies of interventions by identifying the needs of the immigrant population and the local society, and by considering institutional representatives, individuals, and public and private bodies as socio-political actors who move within a field of forces, representing a dynamic network of continuously evolving relationships. Aliseicoop provides assistance in social, housing and working contexts and in particular offers secretarial services, social mentoring, job assistance, and housing intermediation as well as workshops for the empowerment of immigrant associations wishing to pursue entrepreneurship.

The Institute of Work Science (IAW) at the Ruhr-Universität Bochum (RUB), Germany, has a specific profile in the transfer from science to practice. For more than 30 years, the IAW successfully acquires third-party founded projects related to technological and organization change and peoples' adaptation in the workplace. The IAW is the academic partner within the project consortium in charge of the evaluation of processes and measurement of outcomes. On the basis of a multi-level measurement approach the IAW evaluates the success of the partner's activities. A pre-post-measurement-approach includes indicators for individual (self-)employability, employers' prerequisites for refugees' integration into the workforce and regional conditions of the labour market.



The Integration House is the department in Jobcenter Esbjerg that handles all activities in relation to refugees. The Integration House has extensive experience of working with refugees and has a strong focus on method development and implementation of activities and projects that can support and generate the refugees' integration process. The Integration House handles everything from receiving the refugees granted asylum, offering temporary housing, family counseling services, authority work, including referral to language school, administration of social services, cooperation with NGOs, etc.



IGAM, The Research Centre on Asylum and Migration, was founded in 2013 by a group of academics, researchers, journalists and humanitarian workers, as an independent and non-profit association to fill the void of independent research centre in Turkey dealing with asylum and migration. The purpose of the organization is to contribute to the development of international refugee laws and principals, and to promote their effective implementation in Turkey. The main activities of the organisation are to conduct academic studies, support academic research, create databases, raise public awareness, organize training and establish networks.



Cidis Onlus is an Italian non-profit organization working to guarantee equal rights and opportunities for migrants, refugees and asylum seekers, and to promote Italy as a multicultural society. Cidis Onlus operates in central and southern Italy to achieve cultural diversity, equal opportunities for all and social cohesion, promoting intercultural dialogue and fighting prejudice, racism and xenophobia.



Habitat Association is a non-governmental organization that works in the field of sustainable development. Habitat has been working with all disadvantaged groups and encourages building capacity, equal access for opportunities, increasing social awareness. In this regard, Habitat divides its studies into 4 different programs; digital transformation, financial awareness, entrepreneurship and socioeconomic cohesion.
